



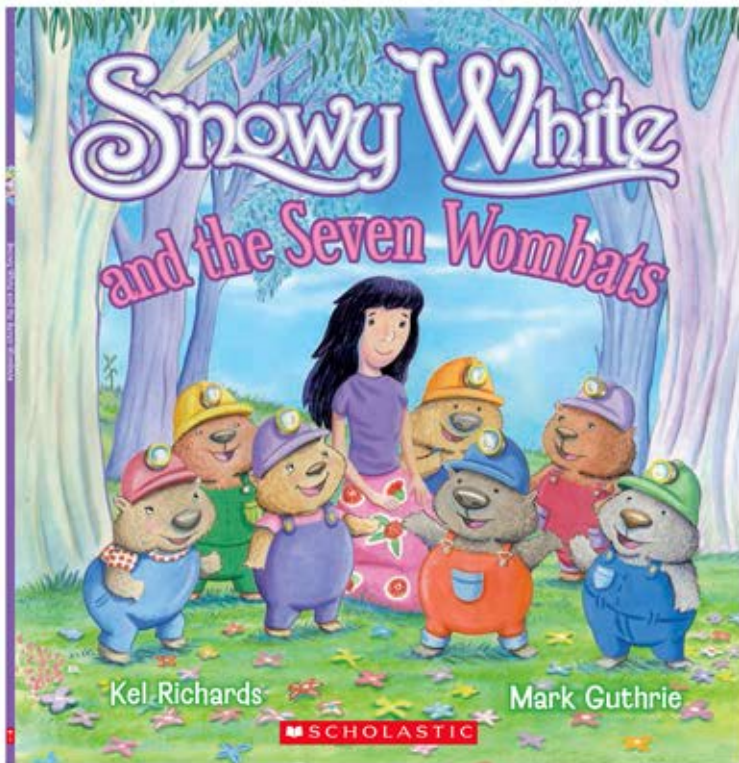

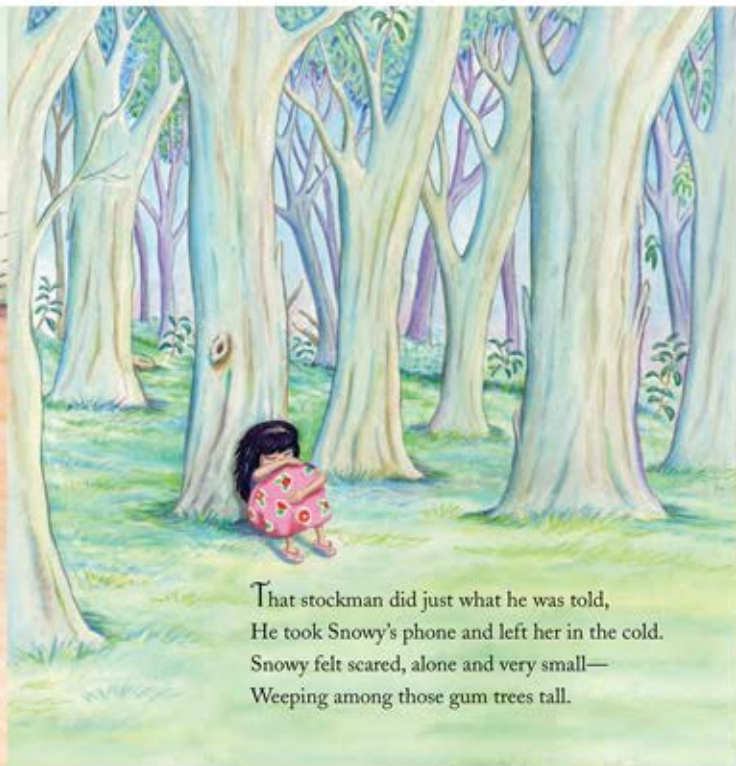
Down near the Great Australian Bight

Her step-mum was the Queen of Mean!



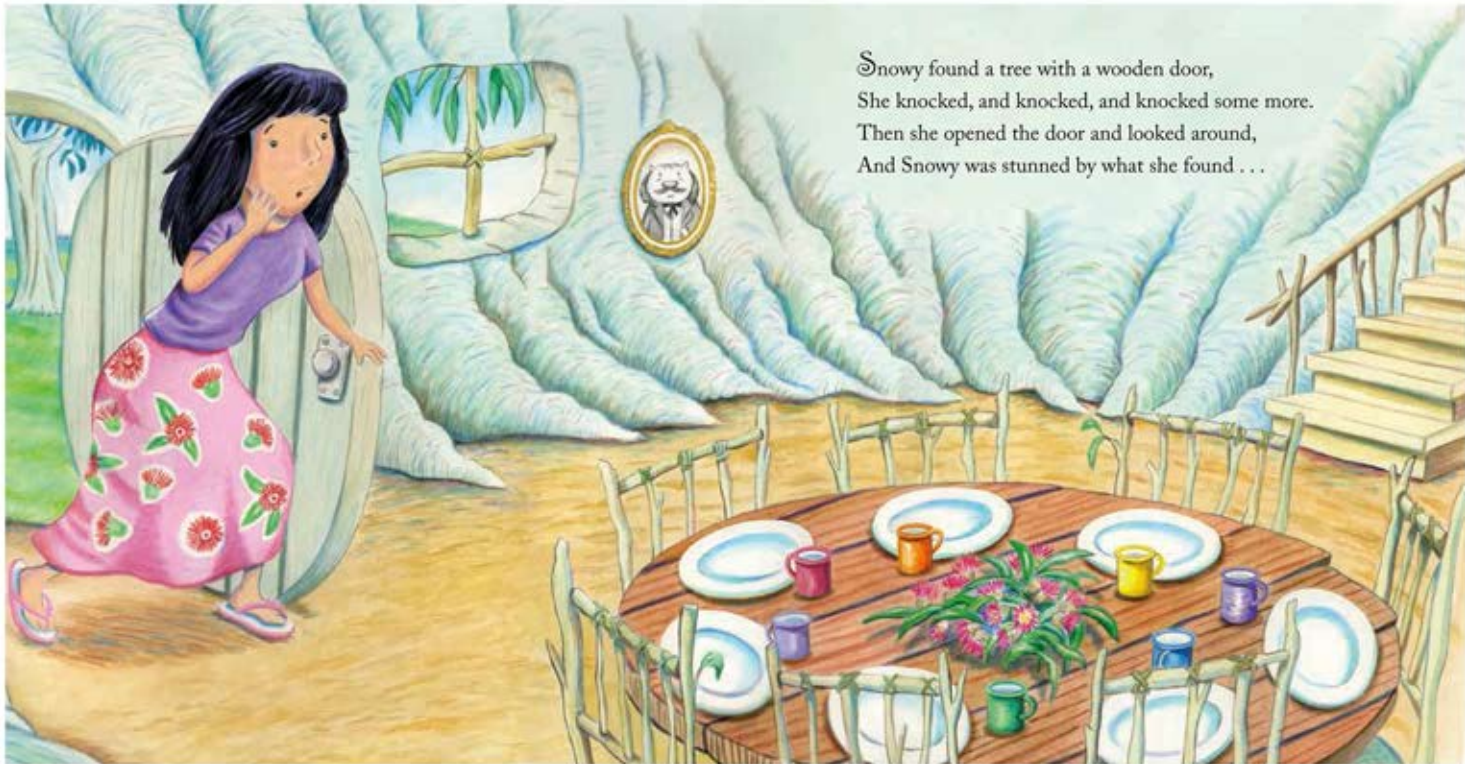
This made the Mean Queen hopping mad.

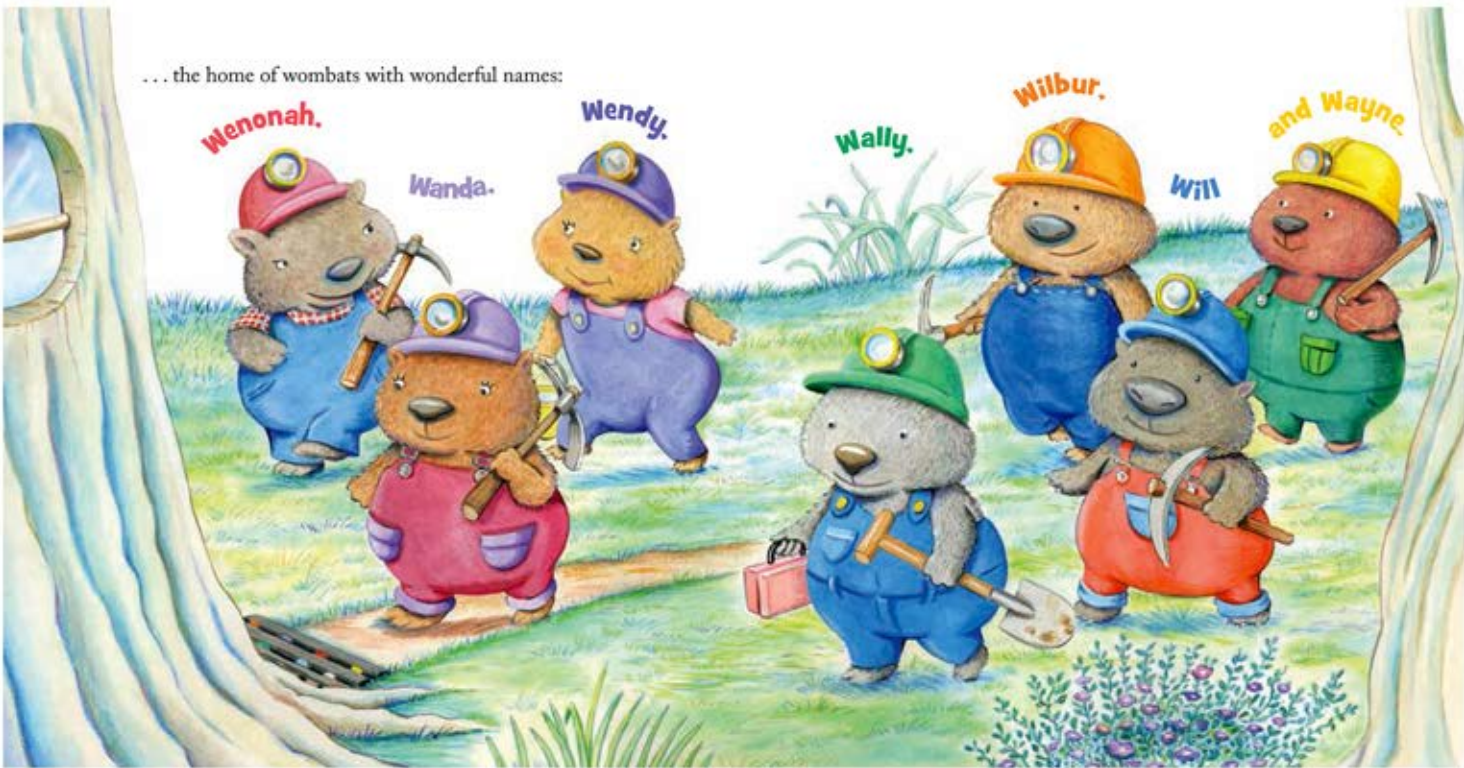

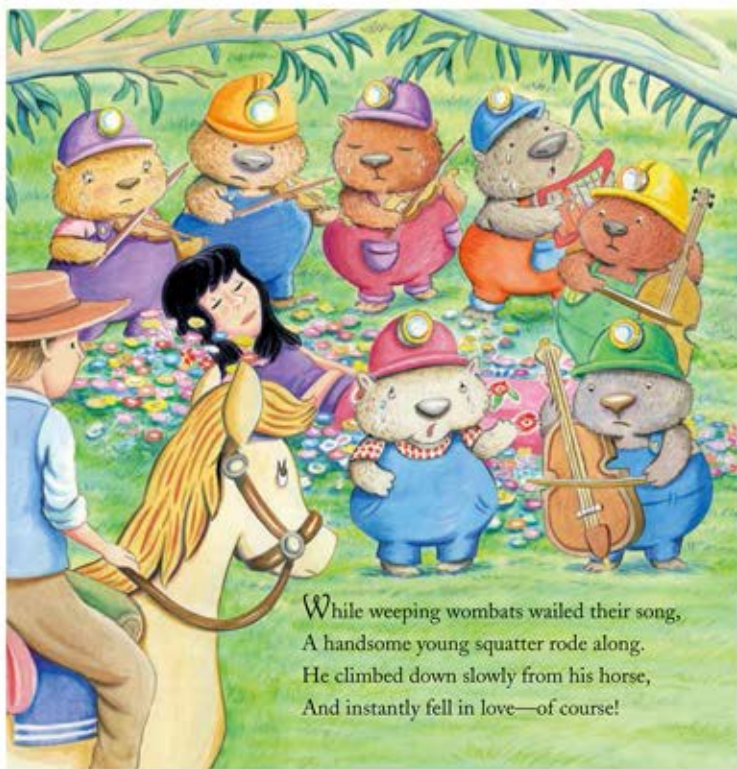
